How to Use This Guide

Before looking at the different summer opportunities, start by asking yourself the following questions. You can jot down your thoughts to refer to when you look through the guide.

- What type of learning experience would I like to have (academic, internship, a job, etc.)?
- What are my interests, if any, and does this program/job include some of my interests or enable me to explore some new interests?
- What is my preferred location (i.e. a college campus, community-based program, or abroad)?
- How far am I willing to travel for my summer experience?
- Am I looking for a free program or am I able to support myself financially to participate? How much can my family contribute?
- What are the requirements for participating in the programs that interest me? Do I meet the requirements?
- Is the program free or are there costs associated with participation?
- Does the program provide scholarships? If so, is there a separate application process?

Things to Keep In Mind...

- Use the chart on the next page to record notes about the different programs as you look through the Guide.
- Pay careful attention to the application timeline and be sure to meet ALL deadlines. Some programs have mandatory orientations and multiple deadlines. These deadlines are final and not flexible.
- Allow yourself enough time to have an adult read over your completed application. **Tip:** Don't ever send your first draft, always have a second person proofread your answers.
- Don't put all of your eggs in one basket! Apply to at least **THREE** programs. You want to have options!
- Make copies of any documents you include in your application if you send them by mail, in case some files are misplaced or lost.
- Ask an adult (your college counselor, a teacher, parent, trusted adult) to help you prepare for interviews if the program's application process requires it.
